Snow or Ice; Vehicle Management Plan

The basic goal is easy: if snow is imminent or occurring, only park in the three spaces closest to Unit F (Liz's, next to the leftmost garage). Next, try to move your vehicle after the lot has been plowed, in order that a second, later plowing can clear out those three parking spaces.

Parking when snow is likely: the best way to manage our parking lot when snow is expected is to *remove* all cars from:

- 1) The three "Eastern" spaces closet to Unit C [most snow is dumped there]
- 2) The two "Western" spaces near Unit I [some snow may go there]
- 3) The three "uphill" spaces, near the mailboxes [for early plow use].

The three spaces near the garage by Unit F should be used. When those three are filled, park <u>between</u> the garages, first using the left or right slot, along a garage. As soon as the spaces near the mailboxes are plowed, please *move* your vehicles from between the garages into the mailbox spaces, so the slots between the garages can be plowed/snow-blown in a follow-up visit by the snow contractor.

In winter, **PLEASE,** <u>know</u> where *anyone* coming to your unit has parked: call a **Board member for advice if you are at all unsure about what to do about parking.** This especially applies to service providers and overnight guest.

Finally, if there is an extra visitor's vehicle at your unit, you MUST have a key for it and the vehicle must be movable under its own power, in order for the snow removal company to be able to complete their work. Snow-removal workers <u>are</u> <u>not</u> allowed to clean off or move a vehicle under the terms of their insurance.
